

## INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

The “baptism” of the Holy Spirit is central to the Christian life. It is neither an option nor something only for the elite, but is something Jesus said would be given to all who “ask”. Jesus told us the importance of Holy Spirit and that it is better that He go to the Father because He would send us the Holy Spirit which would enable us to do the things He did.

- Because of the Holy Spirit there are gifts given to the body of Christ for ministry. *1 Cor 12:1-10*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is fruit in the Christian life. *Gal 5:22-23*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is power to live victoriously. *Rom 6:10-14*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is the ability to witness. *Acts 1:8*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is healing, evangelism, social justice, outreach, etc. *Jn 14:12*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is love in our hearts. *Rom 5:5*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is guidance and revelation of Truth *Jn 16:13*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit there is true worship. *Jn 4:23*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit we are born again. *Jn 3:3-8*
  - Because of the Holy Spirit we can put to death the deeds of the flesh *Gal 5:16*
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- Jesus was conceived by the Holy Spirit *Lk 1:35*
  - Jesus was baptized by the Holy Spirit *Lk 3:22*
  - Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit *Lk 4:1*
  - Jesus ministered in the power of the Holy Spirit *Lk 4:18*
  - Jesus was raised from the dead by the Holy Spirit
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- We are to be conceived (born again) by the Holy Spirit *Jn 3:3-8*
  - We are to be baptized in the Holy Spirit *Mark 1:8*
  - We are to be filled with the Holy Spirit *Acts 2:4*
  - We are to be lead by and minister in the power of the Holy Spirit *Rom 8:14*
  - We are to be raised from the dead by the power of the Holy Spirit *Rom 6:4*

You can not read through the book of Acts without noticing the centrality of the work and ministry of the Holy Spirit as manifest through the early church. The early church was filled with the Holy Spirit and walked in “signs, miracles and wonders”.

There were healings, deliverances, conversions, transformations and even raising people from the dead. There was preaching with boldness; they stood firm before kings and religious rulers; they evangelized entire cities and brought Christianity into heathen.

A quick synopsis of the early church compared to most mainline churches in the west shows a startling contrast. The Holy Spirit was vibrant in the early church and thus the first century Christians had a vitality that was compelling and attractive. People were attracted, joined the church and were transformed, being set free from sin. All of this is the work of the Holy Spirit.

His Son Jesus did. A Spirit filled church was what He had in mind and it began on the Day of Pentecost. That mighty rushing wind and flaming tongues of fire that rested on the 120 in the upper room transformed the world. It began in Jerusalem, spread to Judea, then into Samaria and then spread into the whole world.

We believe that *Acts 1:8* is a key verse: ***“don’t leave Jerusalem until you have received power from on high. Then you will be my witnesses, in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria and to the uttermost parts of the earth.”*** No Holy Spirit, no witness; no Holy Spirit, no power; No Holy Spirit, no healing; No Holy Spirit, no freedom; No Holy Spirit, no deliverance.

May our Lord Jesus Christ give you a spirit of wisdom and revelation as you use this workbook. And may your life and your church come to know the fullness of the Holy Spirit.
